

Hay – Graze

What is it?

A Pasture Mixture with a high inclusion of AC Grazeland designed for those HIGHLY productive fields for season long use and REAPS the benefits of grazing alfalfa. It can also be harvested as hay.

Why grow it?

Features	Benefits
Season long high quality pasture	AC Grazeland, Okay Orchardgrass and Fleet Meadow Brome make the perfect pasture mix for those highly productive fields destined for pasture starting growth early in the spring and producing until first killer frost
Medium rotation	This mixture will produce high yields under a Medium Rotation system, 4 to 6 years before production starts to decline
Very rapid regrowth	Under proper weather conditions plants can recover within 25 and 30 days after defoliation
Makes excellent hay	This mixture can also provide producers with high quality hay
Excellent finishing pasture	High nutrient value to finish cattle on during the growing season
Best suited	Best suited for Moist Black, Black, Grey Luvisol soil zones and Under Irrigation

How to grow it...

Seeding Information	Adaptations	Management
14 lbs/acre	Well drained, neutral, highly productive soils preferred	Stand would consist of approximately 43% AC Grazeland, 43% Okay Orchardgrass and 14% Fleet Meadow Brome
Seed no deeper than ½ inch	Low to moderate tolerance to saline and alkaline soils	Best results when rotationally grazed. Do not graze while dormant
Seed bed should be firm; packing may be required before seeding to prevent crusting	Considered an Early Maturing Type mixture, thus high management is required for best results	Soil test prior to seeding and fertilize accordingly for nitrogen, phosphate, potash and sulfur. Monitor on a yearly basis
