

Feeder Perennial Ryegrass

What is it?

A more persistent, high quality, high yielding perennial ryegrass able to accommodate multi-cut systems!

Why grow it?

Features	Benefits
Improved persistence	➤ Better persistence than other perennial ryegrasses for increased stand longevity
High palatability	➤ Excellent livestock performance as a result of very leafy, vegetative growth
Endophyte free	➤ Suitable for animal consumption
Rapid regrowth	➤ Contributes to very leafy season long growth for multi-cut, green chop systems, or extended fall grazing
High yielding	➤ Yields 103% of checks; reported at 5-8 t/ha with adequate moisture and fertility
High quality	➤ Good protein and energy levels translate to higher gains

How to grow it...

Seeding Information	Adaptations	Management
Seed 10-20 lbs/ac	Grows best on moist, fertile soils	Start grazing 6-8 weeks after seeding; graze to prevent heading and maintain quality
Seed at ½ inch into a firm seed bed	Tolerance to acidic, saline, and alkaline soils	Regrowth is compromised if hay is cut after early heading
Rapid establishment	Becomes dormant during drought conditions	Fertilize according to soil tests; subsequent nitrogen application will encourage regrowth
