<p>Festival Forage Tall Fescue</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Medium maturity, similar to KY 31 ▪ Developed in Indiana ▪ Excellent forage trial yield data ▪ Improved summer quality and growth ▪ Long lived perennial with good winterhardiness ▪ Good resistance to leaf and stem rust
<p>Fuego Tall Fescue</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Late maturity range (later than KY 31) ▪ European genetics ▪ Softer, narrower leaf with lower lignin content ▪ Improved palatability equaling higher animal intake ▪ Excellent for grazing and in mixtures
<p>Seine Tall Fescue</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Medium-late maturity range (slightly earlier than Fuego) ▪ European type with delicate leaves ▪ Aggressive tillering plant with relaxed leaves ▪ High nutrition values and improved animal intake ▪ Good rust resistance ▪ Broadly adapted to a variety of soil types and climatic conditions
<p>Stockman Tall Fescue</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Medium-early maturity range (slightly earlier than Tuscany II) ▪ Improved disease resistance ▪ Strong Spring performance for early pasture or hay production ▪ Excellent heat/drought tolerance ▪ Adapts to a wide range of soil types and climatic conditions
